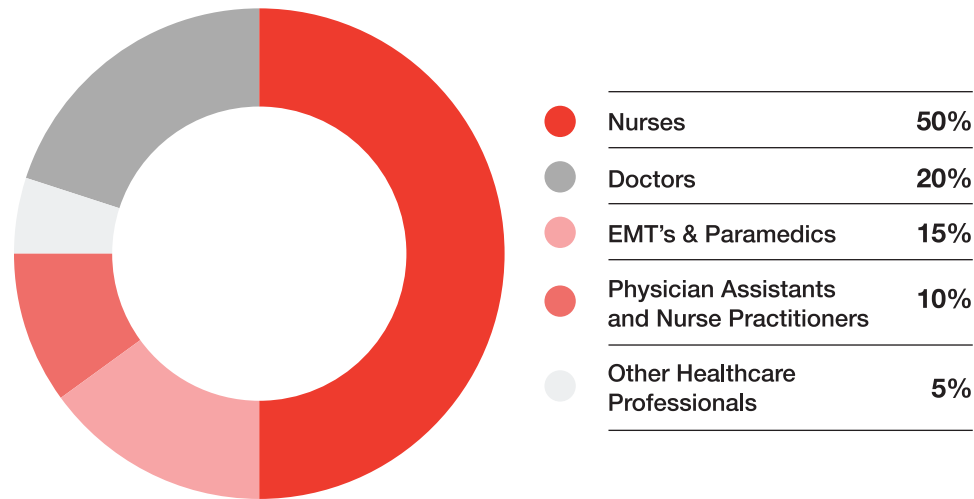


Volunteers from all 50 states signed up with COVID Care Force to serve patients across North America.

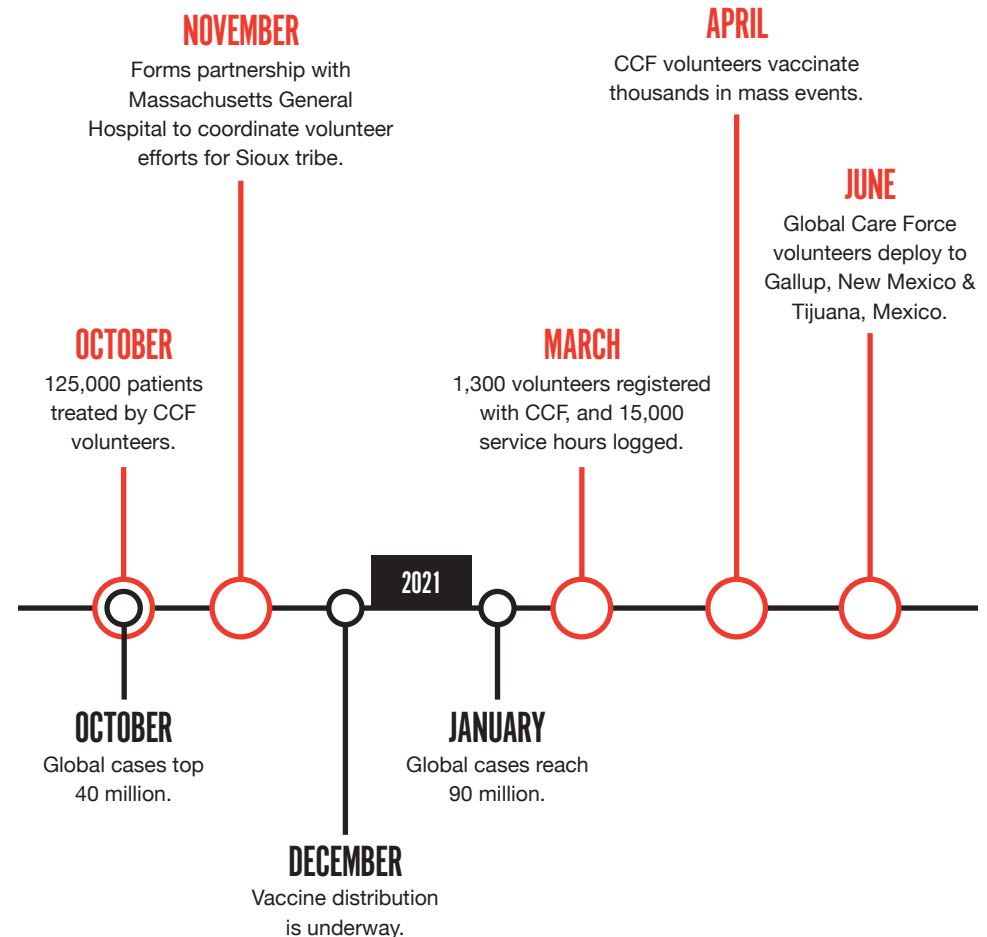
